

## Formatting your paper for publishing in *Applied Economics Quarterly*

- **English:** If you are not a native English speaker, please have your paper proofread *carefully* by one. This is crucial for the quality of both your work and our journal. Furthermore, even seemingly simple cases of incorrect usage (for example, wrong prepositions) can lead to serious misunderstandings and a general lack of clarity about your paper's main points. Either US or UK English is fine, but please be consistent!
- **Page 1:** Link authors' names to affiliations using asterisks. Place each author's affiliation in a separate footnote at the bottom of the page. Please include a thank-you to the referees and a disclaimer for errors. For example (see also footnotes below):

- **Headings, Subheadings, Titles of Tables and Figures:** all words capitalized except a, and, the, and prepositions. Capitalize the word following a colon in a title.
- **Tables and Figures:** please indicate where they should appear in the text ("Table 1 about here")
- **Footnotes:** <sup>1</sup> See Tichy (1994); .....
- **References in text:** no commas between name and year, commas separating citations  
"...is driven by the exploitation of scale economies (Krugman 1983, Helpman 1984)..."
- **References at end of the paper:**
